

Wiley (now 29-19 overall) used the big inning to topple Miles 22-25) 10-0 in Game 2 of the Black College Baseball World Series presented by Tyson Foods at Riverwalk Park – home of the Class AA Montgomery Biscuits – Wednesday in a contest ended after seven innings due to a mercy rule.

The NAIA power from Marshall, Texas, enjoyed a five-run fourth inning to plow ahead of the Golden Bears and to advance to a winner's bracket meeting Thursday against tourney No. 1 seed Talladega.

Wiley bolstered an 11-hit attack and seven shutout innings with two hits apiece from Amir Mason and Ajari Camp as WU did all the damage with 10 singles and just one double in the errorless encounter.

The winning pitcher Jaylen Cream (now 5-1) turned in one of the top, complete-game showings in the four-year history of the BCBWS presented by Tyson with a four-hitter, three strikeouts and two walks. Miles never had a serious run scoring threat on the afternoon.

Miles losing pitcher Nike Copen (5-5 and batting .414 entering the World Series) had a double to try and help his cause as pitcher-DH.

Wiley advances to face the tourney's No. 1 seed Talladega at 9 a.m. in Game 4 Thursday.
